

Pakistan's Transparency ranking worse off under PTI

The perception of corruption in Pakistan has seen a rise for the third straight year, with the country sliding 16 places to rank 140th out of 180 countries surveyed by watchdog Transparency International (TI). In 2020, Pakistan's Corruption Perception Index (CPI) was 31 and it was ranked 124th out of 180 countries, but this year that score has fallen to 28. CPI ranks 180 countries and

territories by their perceived levels of public sector corruption on a scale of zero (highly corrupt) to 100 (very clean).

Dread the day when I'll be back on streets, warns PM Imran

Expressing confidence that people would never take to the streets against him, especially on the call of the 'tainted' opposition, Prime Minister Imran Khan warned his opponents that if he was forced out of office, he would become even more dangerous for them.

Mr Khan will meet Chinese leaders for an overall review of the entire gamut of bilateral ties, besides attending the inaugural session of the Winter Olympics in Beijing. The session was attended by Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi, Minister for Energy Hammad Azhar, Finance Minister Shaukat Tarin, Information Minister Fawad Chaudhry, Planning Minister Asad Umar, Adviser on Commerce Abdul Razak Dawood, National Security Adviser Dr Moeed Yousuf, Army Chief Gen Qamar Javed Bajwa, Special Assistant on CPEC Khalid Mansoor and other senior officers.

Siachin demilitarisation idea: Pakistan takes cautious approach

Pakistan did not outright reject India's recent proposal about possibility of the demilitarisation of the Siachen Glacier saying Pakistan was committed to improving relations with India and have a dialogue which is meaningful, constructive, result-oriented and sustained.

C/A deficit swells to \$9.1 billion in July-December

Current account deficit jumped to \$9.1 billion in the first six months of this fiscal year, compared to a surplus of \$1.2 billion in the same period last year, mostly because of a yawning trade gap. The current account deficit represented 5.7 percent of gross domestic product (GDP). On a calendar year basis, the deficit stood at \$12.2 billion in 2021, compared with a surplus of \$245 million a year ago.

Pakistan launches \$1 billion Sukuk Bond after four years

Pakistan entered the Islamic-denominated Sukuk Bond market after a pause of four years for raising \$1 billion at an offered yield of 7.95 percent against the initial price targeting range of 8.25 to 8.37 percent. It is probably the highestever yield offered for asset-backed Islamic Sukuk Bond for Pakistan. The ruling PTI had always opposed the Sukuk Bond when it was sitting on the opposition benches; it had argued that the country's assets were mortgaged to get loans.

10 soldiers martyred in Kech gunbattle with terrorists

Ten soldiers of security forces were martyred in an exchange of fire with terrorists in Kech, Balochistan, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said in a statement. According to details, terrorists fired at security forces check-post in Kech, Balochistan on night of January 25 and 26. During intense exchange of firing, one terrorist was killed and several others injured. While repulsing terrorists fire raid, 10 soldiers embraced martyrdom.

PM's China visit to focus on joint ventures: FM

Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi said the visit of Prime Minister Imran Khan to China would encompass discussions on advancing joint ventures and pacing up progress on the China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

Afghanistan

Taliban hail Oslo meet as success 'in itself'

On their first visit to Europe since returning to power, the Taliban held landmark talks with Western diplomats in Oslo over the humanitarian crisis in Afghanistan, a meeting the Islamist regime's delegation called an "achievement in itself". The international community has however insisted the Taliban must respect human rights before aid can be resumed to Afghanistan, where hunger threatens more than half population.

Bomb on bus kills seven in western Afghan city

January 23, 2022, Dawn

A bomb blast on a minibus killed at least seven people in the western Afghan city of Herat. The sticky bomb was attached to the fuel tank of the bus, and left nine other people wounded.

EU re-establishes presence in Afghanistan

January 22, 2022, Dawn

The European Union said it was re-establishing a physical presence in Afghanistan for humanitarian purposes, but stressed it was not formally recognising the Taliban-led administration. It was the first such announcement by a Western power since the 27-nation EU and many governments withdrew staff and diplomats from Afghanistan as Kabul fell to the hardline Taliban last August.

India, Central Asia to form working group on Afghanistan, TAPI pipeline talks back on table

In their first-ever summit meeting held on January 27, India and the five Central Asian countries of Tajikistan, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan and Kyrgyz Republic have decided to form a joint working group on Afghanistan, while agreeing to a "common approach" when dealing with the Taliban regime there.

Taliban Detain Dozens Trying To Leave Afghanistan 'Illegally' By Air

Dozens of people were stopped from "illegally" leaving Afghanistan by air and several women among them are being detained until they are collected by male relatives. Some nations and international NGOs have since operated irregular chartered flights extracting Afghans, but Taliban authorities have increasingly clamped down.

Afghanistan: How the Taliban stand to benefit from Norway talks

Norwegian authorities have said the ongoing international talks with the Taliban are not tantamount to legitimizing the Islamist group. But human rights activists, particularly those from Afghanistan, do not agree with these claims. They have slammed Norway's decision to host the militant group, which seized power in Afghanistan last August.

India to Start Sending Wheat Consignments to Afghanistan via Pakistan from Next Month: Sources

IMF Says China's Economic Imbalances Have Worsened January 28, 2022, The Wall Street Journal

Imbalances in the Chinese economy have worsened and delayed China's transition to consumption-led growth, the International Monetary Fund said in an annual review on Friday, slashing its outlook for the country this year. Reflecting continued weakness in consumption, the IMF now expects China's gross domestic product to expand 4.8% this year, down from its previous projection of 5.7%. "Growth momentum has slowed considerably, with consumption lagging every other part of the GDP," said Helge Berger, the IMF's mission chief for China.

China's ambassador to US warns of conflict over Taiwan

China and the United States could end up in a military conflict if the United States encourages Taiwan's independence, Beijing's ambassador to Washington Qin Gang has said. "Let me emphasise this. The Taiwan issue is the biggest tinderbox between China and the United States," Qin told US media outlet National Public Radio in an interview broadcast on Friday.

U.N. May visit Chinese Region Shrouded by Rights Accusations

Japan

Boris Johnson works toward possible mid-February visit to Japan

Japan and the U.K. are working toward a visit by Prime Minister Boris Johnson to Japan for a summit with his counterpart, Fumio Kishida, in mid-February, Nikkei has learned. The leaders are expected to discuss expanding their cooperation in security, with an eye on China's aggression in the Indo-Pacific area. They are also likely to discuss the tensions surrounding Ukraine.

IMF raises alarm over Japan's massive pandemic spending

Japan's policy response to the pandemic has been "exceptionally strong," the International Monetary Fund said on Friday, but warned against its repeated use of supplementary budgets that has led to a major spike in spending. "Sizable supplementary budgets have been frequently assembled, leading to upward revisions of expenditures from the initial budgets," the IMF said in a statement after its review, urging Japan to restore "predictability" in the size of spending.

Japan to partner with U.S. on 6G standards for unmanned tech

Japan and the U.S. will work together to lead the creation of international standards in unmanned technology that uses 6G communications, aiming to keep Chinese companies from dominating a field expected to include self-driving cars and fully automated factories. The Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications may call on companies to form a consortium toward this end by September.

Japan, U.S., South Korea eye meeting of top diplomats next month

Japan, the United States and South Korea are planning to hold a foreign ministers' meeting in the U.S. state of Hawaii in mid-February, a Japanese government source has said. Japanese Foreign Minister Yoshimasa Hayashi, U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken and South Korean Foreign Minister Chung Eui-yong are expected to participate in the meeting, the source said Friday.

Former PM Naoto Kan under fire for comparing Nippon Ishin to Hitler

Former Prime Minister Naoto Kan has come under fire for saying on Twitter that Nippon Ishin no Kai reminds him of Germany's wartime dictator Adolf Hitler. Referring to former Nippon Ishin leader Toru Hashimoto and others, Kan, who belongs to the main opposition Constitutional Democratic Party of Japan, tweeted on Friday, "Their eloquence reminds me of Hitler when he rose to power in Germany at a time of confusion after World War I."

Korea

Lee, Yoon in dead heat at 35% each: poll

Ruling party presidential candidate Lee Jae-myung and his main opposition rival Yoon Suk-yeol are in a dead heat at 35 percent support each, a poll showed Friday. Lee of the liberal Democratic Party (DP) gained 1 percentage point from a Jan. 18-20 survey, while Yoon of the conservative People Power Party (PPP) gained 2 points, according to the Gallup Korea poll of 1,000 adults conducted from Tuesday to Thursday.

S. Korea voices 'strong regret' over Japan's Sado mine heritage push

South Korea on Friday expressed "strong regret" over Japan's push to recommend a former gold mine associated with wartime forced labour as a candidate for a UNESCO World Heritage site and called for its retraction. Seoul's Second Vice Foreign Minister Choi Jong-moon called in Japanese Ambassador to South Korea Aiboshi Koichi to lodge a protest after Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida announced plans to nominate the controversial mine on Sado Island for the 2023 UNESCO heritage list.

Seoul faces conundrum over option of North Korea preemptive strike

If South Korea faces an imminent attack from nuclear-armed North Korea, what is the most viable military option to defend the country and prevent incalculable and irreparable damage? Seoul-based experts say South Korea would have no option but to consider launching a preemptive strike, although the anticipatory use of force would come with a certain price. That price could far outweigh potential gains, experts say. But the bigger problem is Pyongyang's mounting artillery, missile and nuclear threats that not only make a preemptive strike plan more indispensable, but also restrain Seoul's preemptive strike capabilities.

North Korea confirms test-firing of long-range cruise, surface-to-surface missiles

North Korea confirmed Friday this week's two weapons tests involving longrange cruise, and surface-to-surface tactical guided missiles, and vowed to "keep developing powerful warheads." On Thursday, South Korea's military said the North fired what appeared to be two short-range ballistic missiles toward the East Sea, marking its sixth such launch this month. This latest saber-rattling came just two days after Pyongyang launched two apparent cruise missiles from an inland area.

<u>Minister to seek ways to get China's de facto ban on Korean content lifted at</u> <u>Beijing Olympics</u>

Culture, Sports and Tourism Minister Hwang Hee said he will seek ways to persuade China to lift its de facto ban on South Korean content as he is set to lead the Korean government delegation at the upcoming Beijing Winter Olympics. China imposed the ban to protest South Korea's decision to allow the deployment of a U.S. missile defense system, known as THAAD, in 2016. Since then, Korean TV series, shows and movies have been absent from China's TV networks, formal video streaming platforms and cinemas.

China's Xi Pledges Aid, Vaccines To Central Asia In Bid To Improve Ties
