Event Profile

Since the last edition of this dialogue in November 2020, Japan and India have both faced strategic disturbances in their respective neighbourhoods. These have included India's prolonged border standoff with China and recent developments in Afghanistan which have deeply impacted India's security environment. Similarly, there are unilateral attempts to change the status quo by force in the East and South China Seas.

On the positive side, the Quad, comprising Japan, India, Australia and the U.S., has emerged as the leading proponent of a free and open Indo-Pacific and has stepped-up practical cooperation on key challenges facing the region, including COVID-19 vaccines, climate change and emerging technologies. At their second summit meeting held in September, Quad leaders reaffirmed their commitment to promoting a free, open, rules-based order, rooted in international law and undaunted by coercion, and to bolster security and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific and beyond. A new Australia-UK-US (AUKUS) security partnership has also emerged, to deal with the military aspects of regional stability.

Japan and India have a vital role to play in shaping a free, open, inclusive, cooperative and peaceful regional order in the Indo-Pacific based on their shared values and respect for international law. In the past year, there has been steady progress in their bilateral relationship, especially in the areas of economic infrastructure, regional connectivity, digital technologies, and skill development. They have concluded a Memorandum of Cooperation on a Basic Framework for Partnership for Proper Operation of the System pertaining to "Specified Skilled Worker (SSW)" and overseen the progress of the Japan-India Digital Partnership. There is a clear need for Japan and India to do more to meet the economic challenges in the post-COVID-19 world by seeking new avenues for bilateral cooperation, from boosting people to people ties and joint capacity-building to diversified and resilient supply chains, clean energy, public health, cyber security, emerging technologies, and space cooperation.

The broad theme of the 4th Indo-Pacific Forum will be forging a stronger "Partnership for a Free and Open Indo-Pacific" between Japan and India across multiple domains.
